Summary of HOME First Minor Amendment to the 2024 State of Texas Consolidated Plan One-Year Action Plan

October 2024

Due to a reassessment of allocation priorities, the State has determined that a portion of its HOME funds initially allocated for development of multifamily rental development should be reallocated to its Single Family Programs, including Homeowner Reconstruction Assistance and Tenant-Based Rental Assistance.

The following amendment shows the necessary changes due to this reallocation of HOME funds. Changes are made to AP-20, AP-25, and AP-55 reflecting this reallocation.

Estimate the number of extremely low-income, low-income, and moderate-income families to whom the jurisdiction will provide affordable housing as defined by HOME 91.215(b)

Based on the goal descriptions for HOME in the table above, it is estimated that the State will provide affordable housing to 7341,441 extremely low-income, low-income, and moderate-income families.

Beginning in Program Year 2023, \$0 have been dedicated to Goal 16: CDBG Planning/Capacity Building. The principles behind this goal remain important for CDBG subrecipients. Rather than address this goal through a separate competitive opportunity, activities that support this goal are eligible to be requested by subrecipients under the Community Development Fund. The amount to be awarded is currently unknown and depends on how many communities prioritize planning and capacity building activities over other local needs, therefore the amount dedicated to this goal is \$0.
